


# Results of Parental Survey Summer 2022



#### 1. How happy would you say your child/children are at school?




Extremely happy – 53 Somewhat happy – 4 Neither happy nor unhappy – 3 Somewhat unhappy – 2 Very unhappy – 0

#### 2. How do you feel that we, as a school, communicate with you about life at school, including your child's progress?




Very well – 14 Well – 27 Neutral – 10 Not very well – 11 Poor – 0

#### 3.My child feels safe at school




Strongly agree – 38 Agree – 22 Neutral – 0 Disagree – 2 Strongly disagree – 0


## 4. Have we communicated to you who is responsible for Mental Health and Wellbeing at our school?



## 5. Does your child have someone to talk to at school, including if they are upset about something?




## 6. How well, do we as a school, support your child's learning and development?

## 7. How happy are you with what our school does to support your child/children's wellbeing?




Very happy – 33 Happy – 23 Neither happy nor unhappy – 3 Somewhat unhappy – 2 Very unhappy – 1
