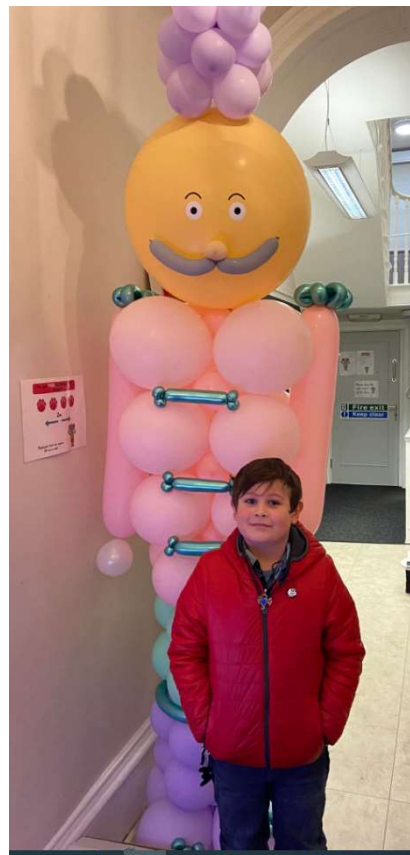
### **Super Star Seth**

### **Exciting Phonics and Early Reading News!**

We are really excited to share some exciting news with you about how we will be teaching phonics and early reading skills at Ripponden.

Starting in the new year, we will be using the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds scheme which has recently been validated by the DfE. We have taken delivery of our brand-new reading books and for those of you who love book post (like Mrs Kenny) you will understand that this definitely makes it feel like Christmas!!!

There are multiple copies of over 100 new reading book titles as well as lovely classroom resources like flashcards and posters.

All our staff took part in training involved in delivering the scheme on Wednesday and are eager to see the impact on our young learners.

We are confident that this scheme will help us to become even better equipped to help all our children develop the reading skills they need to succeed in life. The way the reading scheme works (mainly up to Y3/4) will change slightly and we will send out lots more information about this in the next few weeks and will be arranging a parents' workshop too.

As a reward each child who attends receives a shiny penny for their thoughts. Once a child has collected and kept 5 pennies safe they receive a certificate.
