




#### **School policies**

## Timeline Challenge

This week, we launched our Timeline Challenge, where we asked children to design pictures for various significant historical periods, that Damian will then paint onto the main corridor in school. In addition to the eras we sent out, we would like to add some more in, with either national or local significance. These are:


