As writers and communicators... we will be consolidating basic writing skills including:

- Writing sentences for different purposes by using commands, statements and questions in our writing.
- Spelling all Y2 common exception words correctly
- Correct letter formation including some joins.

Our purpose of writing this half term will be continuing our non-chronological report about an animal of our choice, using the non-fiction book 'The Big Blue Whale' to support our writing. We will then be focusing on the story 'Julian is a Mermaid' and using progressive verbs, co-ordination, apostrophes for contracted forms and new vocabulary to write a story. With Mrs Furnandiz, the children will be exploring Poetry.

As readers we are practising accuracy and fluency through a mixture of whole class reading opportunities, group guided reading and individual reading sessions. We are also developing our retrieval and inference skills as we think about what a text means.

## As historians we will be...

Looking at two great explorers, Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus. We will be looking at what the meaning of exploring is and where these key people happened on our class timeline of historic events. We will answer the question, 'Is there a Limit to Where we Explore?'

Learning how to use an effective search to retrieve information.



As mathematicians we will be...continuing our work on multiplication, division and money and carry on learning about how to tell the time.

We will then move onto work on fractions including recognising and finding halves, quarters and thirds. Furthermore, will we be consolidating and reviewing key maths skills to ensure we're feeling confident in all areas of the KS1 Maths curriculum.

## As scientists we will be...

We will be learning about the life processes of all living things and the affects this has on how they live in their environment. We will be exploring many different habitats including polar, dessert, ocean, woodland and microhabitats.

We will continue to observe and record our findings from our plant experiment, 'Light and Dark' from Spring 2.
