On Monday 15th November everyone in the school community (including parents! (b) are being encouraged to take part in Odd Socks Day to let a little bit of our personality shine through.

Odd Socks Day means children will be in school uniform, but they will be able to wear funky socks to represent their personality for the day. This isn't for fundraising - just to raise awareness and to kick-start the week.

We will be doing a variety of activities in school with a focus on 'One Kind Word' over the week to inform children about bullying and ensuring that we have an accurate understanding of what bullying is and also what it isn't.
